IMPORTANT

On August 11, 2023, the Honorable Lyle E. Frank came in with a "final decision" moving the case from an "injunction" (stoppage) to legally disallowing NYC OLR (Respondents) from forcing any and all Medicare retirees and their Medicare dependents into the new MA Plan or in lieu of MA Plan participation forcing them to pay the GHI Senior Care premium. The following is Hon. Lyle E. Frank's decision:

AMENDED DECISION & ORDER ON MOTION:



On June 5, 2023, the Court issued a preliminary injunction in this matter. The Court has been informed by the parties that they do not wish for the Court to hold any additional argument, nor will there be further submissions. As such, this matter is ripe for a final determination.

The Court therefore grants the petition for the reasons indicated in the July 6, 2023, namely that both the doctrine of promissory estoppel and the provisions of New York City Administrative Code Section 12-126 bars the actions sought to be taken by respondents. The Court does not reach the last point of relief in the petition, namely that the respondents should be enjoined from disseminating alleged false and misleading statements of the Aetna Medicare Advantage Plan. Based on the foregoing, it is hereby ORDERED that the Respondents are permanently enjoined from requiring any City retirees, and their dependents from being removed from their current health insurance plan(s), and from being required to either enroll in an Aetna Medicare Advantage Plan or seek their own health coverage.



Of course, the City has filed its Appeal:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that respondents-defendants appeal to the Appellate Division, First Department, from the amended order of Supreme Court, New York County (Frank, J.), dated and entered August 11, 2023 (NYSCEF No. 102), which also brings up for appellate review all prior orders in the action.



retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents for Medicare Part B IRMAA premiums (excluding any penalties) paid during the calendar year. IRMAA reimbursements are not issued automatically. You must reapply each year you qualify. The IRMAA reimbursement is separate from the standard Part B reimbursement. The 2022 IRMAA annual reimbursement will be issued during the 3rd week of October 2023.

If you are currently receiving your pension check through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) or direct deposit, your IRMAA reimbursement will be deposited directly into your bank account. This is separate from your pension payment. If you don't have EFT or direct deposit, you should receive a check in the mail.

WHAT IS IRMAA?

Medicare Part B premiums are based on income. Some people with higher incomes may pay an additional amount added to the standard Part B premium. This additional amount is called the Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA).

HOW IS IRMAA DETERMINED?

The Social Security Administration (SSA) determines if you (or you and your spouse) owe an IRMAA based on the income you reported on your IRS tax return generally two years prior. meaning two years before the year that you start paying IRMAA (2023 premiums are generally based on 2021 tax return). The income that counts is the Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI). MAGI is the sum of your adjusted gross income (AGI) which can be found on line 11 of your IRS tax form 1040, plus your tax-exempt interest income which can be found on line 2a of your IRS tax form 1040. Those whose MAGI is above the current year's threshold are subject to a sliding scale increase (IRMAA) in their Part B premiums.

The MAGI thresholds used for IRMAA calculations are:

IRS FILING STATUS	2020	2021	2022	2023
Married, filing jointly	\$174,000	\$176,000	\$182,000	\$194,000
All other filing statuses	\$87,000	\$88,000	\$91,000	\$97,000

HOW AM I NOTIFIED IF I OWE IRMAA?

If your income is high enough for IRMAA to apply. Social Security will mail you a predetermination notice. This notice will explain that IRMAA will apply, how this determination was made and how to proceed if any of this information is in error or your situation has changed. After sending out the predetermination notice, Social Security will mail you an initial determination notice informing you that you owe IRMAA on your Part B premiums. This notice also includes how the determination was made and instructions on what to do if you feel it isn't correct. If you receive an initial determination notice, hang onto it, and keep it in a safe place.

HOW DO I PAY IRMAA?


If you're receiving retirement benefits from Social Security and already have your Medicare Part B premiums deducted from your Social Security payment, you don't have to take action if you owe IRMAA. Your IRMAA will automatically be deducted from your Social Security benefit. Otherwise, you should receive a bill for your Part B IRMAA.

FYI:

The September 2023 COLA is 2.5 percent, for a maximum annual increase of \$450.00, or \$37.50 per month before taxes.

The newest form of fraud that is popular today is check washing. Check washing is the act of removing important information from a check and forging new information onto it. The information is removed using an acetone solution such as nail polish remover. The check is then rewritten in the same type of ink used initially in the check. If it looks close enough to the original handwriting, it normally clears. The criminal gets the money, and the victim is left on the hook, which is usually a considerable amount. Someone with even basic skills can create a passable counterfeit check, making this fraud much more dangerous and widespread. Your check in the wrong hands can result in your checking account getting cleaned out.

Fortunately, there are several ways you can ensure that you never become a victim of check washing. The first and easiest way to fight against check washing fraud is to pay online. Most banks, credit cards and utilities services have an app, website, or even an automated payment option you can set up to automatically deduct funds from your account when payment is due. Alternatively, use your bank's "bill pay" option, such as ZELLE, if you must pay via check. Your payment may still be sent as a check, but the information will be printed on it, making check washing utterly useless.

Another way to make your checks less attractive to criminals is to fill out and sign checks using only black gel ink. Gel ink pens are "indelible." It is very hard to remove gel ink from checks, which adds an additional layer of protection.

There are other layers of protection that you can

use to fight back against check washing fraud and identity theft, such as mailing checks using the boxes inside your local post office and reviewing your canceled check images via online banking and ensure they clear for the proper amount.

If you are on vacation or traveling out of the country, there are ways to protect yourself. You can arrange for your mail to be held via the USPS Mobile app. Once held, you can arrange to have it either delivered the next business day after you've returned home or pick it up at your local post office. Once you get the check, know how you'll deposit: either in-person or via your bank's mobile app. Keep in mind that if you choose your bank's mobile deposit option, use a paper shredder to destroy the check and other sensitive documents like bank statements, bills, old tax documents, insurance policies, and other identity-sensitive documents. Another strategy is joining an identity protection service, such as Life Lock, that monitors every area of your identity and how it is used. These services commonly offer a sizeable amount of monetary protection. This applies to check washing fraud. If someone uses one of your checks to wipe out your checking account, an identity theft protection service will reimburse you and, often, fund a lawyer to represent you in court if needed. There is usually a fee associated with membership but it will cost you less than the cost of becoming a victim.

It is unfortunate, but in today's world we must alter our behavior and avoid becoming victims. Check washing is part of a bigger issue, and that is identity theft. Protect your identity and use security best practices to avoid becoming a victim of check washing fraud altogether.


